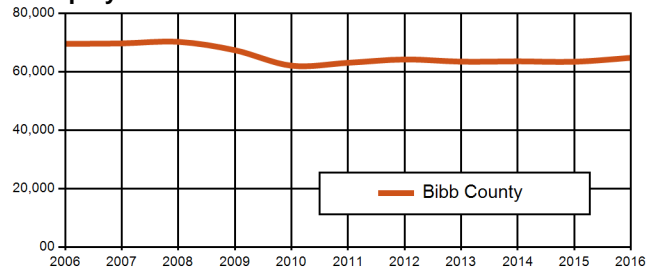

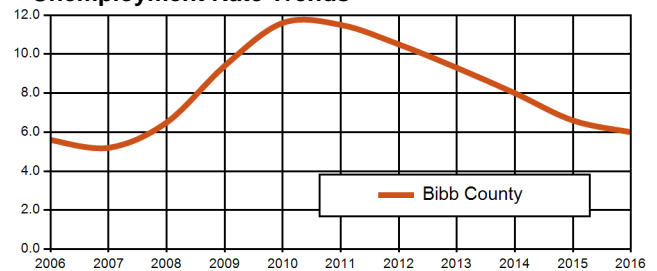

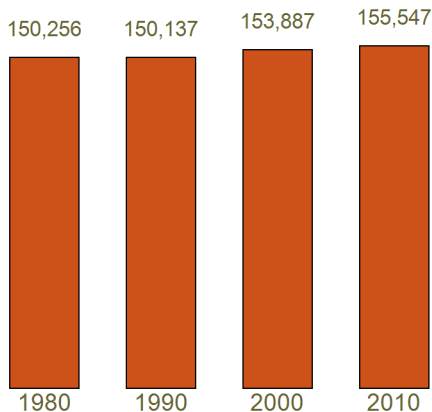
Employment Trends

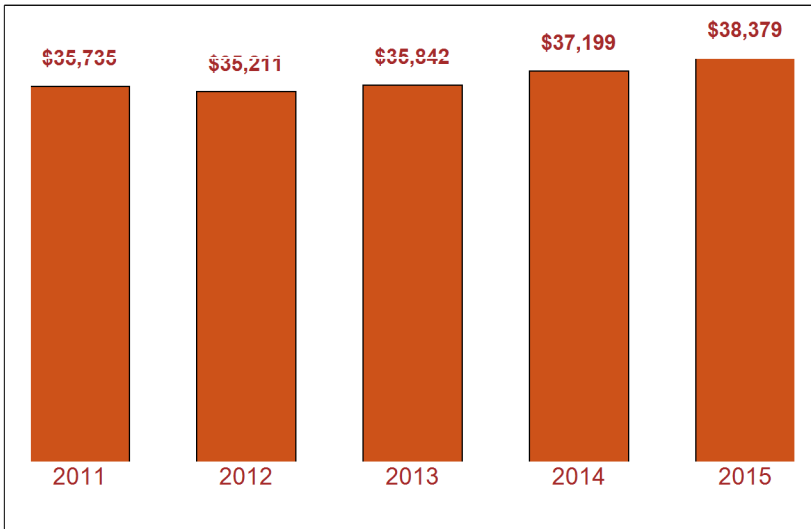

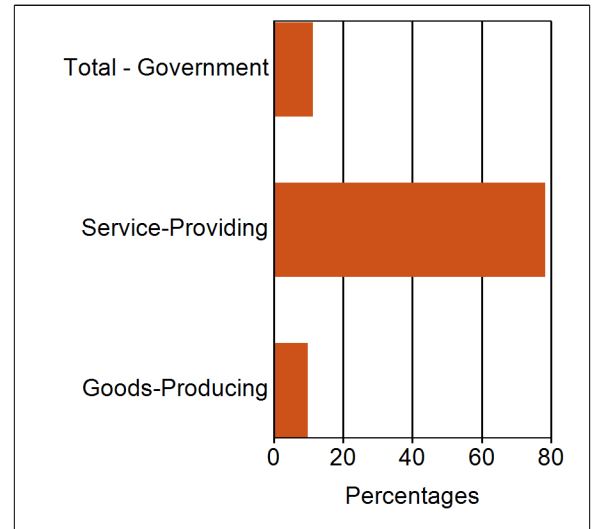
Bibb Per Capita Income
